



Women in Film and Television - Toronto announces 2008 NBC Universal Development Incubator: Call for Applications

(TORONTO – Thursday, January 31, 2008) WIFT-T is pleased to announce the 2008 **NBC Universal Development Incubator**. This national initiative is designed to develop market-driven feature films and support the next generation of Canadian feature filmmakers.

Emerging to intermediate producer and writer teams, with feature-length dramatic projects in development, are encouraged to apply now. Five teams will be chosen to work with international consultants and select industry advisors in a series of small group sessions. Each team will develop a script and prepare preliminary marketing packages. The successful candidates will be selected by a jury of industry representatives. Applicants must be WIFT-T members.

“We are thrilled to offer writers and producers the opportunity to hone their skills through these very focused small group sessions,” said Sadia Zaman, Executive Director of WIFT-T. “We thank NBC Universal for their continued support on this essential program.”

Deadline for Applications: Monday, February 18, 2008

The **NBC Universal Development Incubator** will include additional programming. The **Women’s Writer’s Workshop** will target emerging women screenwriters who have a detailed outline or treatment, and are working on the first draft of a feature script. **The Feature Film Writing Program** will be a three-part refresher course that will take writers through the elements of developing a feature film script. Components will include Feature Structure, Character Development and Dialogue. These workshops will take place throughout April, May and June. Priority registration will be given to WIFT-T members.
